# Arqus Research and Innovation (Arqus RI) Project

## H2020 - Jan 2021-Dec 2023

### Project Summary (Jan 2021)

The Arqus European University Alliance brings together seven\* longstanding prestigious comprehensive research-intensive universities who share extensive experience in joint projects and a similar profile as internationalized institutions with deep regional engagement. Through this project, Arqus aims to **enhance the research and innovation dimension of the Alliance's activities** and to **address current global societal challenges through intensified joint research** characterised by the pursuit of excellence, openness, transparency and effective engagement with society.

Based on analysis of existing strengths, prior cooperation and shared strategic research interests, the Alliance will focus on the **fields of Artificial Intelligence/Digital Transformation and Green Deal/Climate Change** as transversal priority areas for **enhanced research collaboration**, characterised by their interdisciplinarity.

The project is organised around **three major challenges**, all intended to foster a context to nurture sustainable strengthened collaboration. The **first** addresses **Joint Science and Innovation**, through building an Arqus research community, and designing a roadmap for transformation(al) excellence. The **second** centres on **New Perspectives on Research**, seeking to strengthen human capital through alternative approaches to assessment and recognition, and to re-thinking transfer, with special reference to the Social Sciences, Humanities and the Arts. The **third, Open to Society**, focusses on the culture change brought by Open and Citizen Science.

Arqus Research & Innovation aims to complement and build on efforts already underway to foster scientific cooperation within the European University consortium, and to seek synergies between the education, research and innovation dimensions of Arqus.

# I/ Research and Innovation in Arqus II

## (Oct 2022-Sept2026)

### Introduction to Arqus II

Arqus II is the continuation of the Arqus European University Alliance initiated in 2019. Arqus is composed of the universities of Granada, Graz, Leipzig, Lyon1, Minho, Padua, Vilnius and Wroclaw. Its vision for 2032 is that of a forward-looking, open, integrated, and research driven European University, building transformative excellence with and for all.

### **Arqus II will upscale and institutionalize the pilot actions implemented in Arqus I.**

Arqus II will deepen its focus on communities, promoting student and staff engagement through three separate initiatives: the **Arqus Living Lab** as a generator of innovative responses to three major and interconnected thematic priorities for the XX1st century: Climate Change & Sustainable Development; Artificial Intelligence & Digital Transformation; European Identity & Heritage. **Arqus Communities of Practice** will address domain-based challenges for professional and academic staff; the **Arqus Student Agora** will constitute a dynamic framework for student-led co-creation initiatives.

Arqus II will advance in joint flexible learning pathways, in innovative teaching, in **enhancing the experience of early-stage researchers**, and in synergies with its local eco-systems.

It will promote **three cross-cutting enablers**: traditional and innovative forms of mobility for all; inclusion and diversity; plurilingual and intercultural competence for democratic culture. In order to fulfil these tasks, Arqus II will develop a common digital environment for its collaborative work, as a joint virtual learning and teaching platform, digital tools for federated digital identity and secure certification. It will set up a **Talent & Innovation Fund** to attract excellent postgraduate students, to offer seed-funding for small scale bottom-up initiatives, and to test new forms of mobility. Finally, Arqus II will establish a development unit to facilitate data and evidence-based analysis for the strategic planning of the future of the Alliance.

## II/ Research and Innovation in Arqus II (Oct 2022-Sept2026)

### Work Package 02: Arqus Living Lab

The Arqus Living Lab (WP02) will be an open space for the promotion of multiple bottom-up groupings of students, academics, professionals, external stakeholders such as companies, non-governmental organizations, local and regional authorities, schools, museums and so on, working together towards the common goal of contributing to solve Europe's long-term challenges through education, research and innovation in a science-based and democratic way.

It is conceived as a **dynamic community generator of bottom-up initiatives** of all kinds leading to actual implementation in joint flexible academic offer of all kinds, including full joint degree programmes at EQF6, 7 and 8 (WP06), teaching innovation (WP05), seed funding applications for innovative learning activities (WP13), links with and between our local ecosystems (WP08), **doctoral activities** (WP07), or **research and innovation initiatives** (not included in this Work Plan and funded by other programmes and sources).

### Work Package 07: Arqus PhD Pursuit

Continuing and expanding successful activities of Action Line 6 of Arqus I, this WP will provide early-stage researchers with the skills necessary to become internationally competitive in academia, to launch successful careers outside academia and to be prepared for existing and emerging grand societal challenges. These aims will be reached by setting up an **interdisciplinary mentoring programme**, establishing an **Early-Stage Researcher Development Resource Centre** and designing the framework for a **visiting scholar scheme for postdoc researchers**.

WP7 will also intensify the establishment of sustainable networks and collaboration involving Arqus early-stage researchers and will benefit from the support of a PhD Advisory Board to guarantee the quality of its actions.

Its ultimate goal is to contribute to the co-creation of new actionable knowledge, thus contributing to regional and European innovation strategies.

### Work Package 13: Arqus Talent & Innovation Fund

This fund will aim to **attract talent at postgraduate level from around the world** to Arqus through a European University Scholarship Scheme, with an **annual call for a small number of Arqus Master's and doctoral scholarships** to be held at a minimum of two of the Arqus partner universities.

It will test **innovative mobility formats, including for researchers**, aim to produce joint calls an offer **seed funding** for: challenge-based teaching and learning with the possibility of having an associated research activity and other innovative initiatives, e.g. to allow **preparation of funding applications**, or to carry out small initial pilot runs.
