The project: ADVOCACY HUB: Students' Voices at the Human Rights Centre

We're happy to announce the inaugural seminar of our student-led initiative, ADVOCACY HUB: Students' Voices at the Human Rights Centre. Supported by the University of Padova and the Human Rights Centre Antonio Papisca, the project aims to bring together theory and practice, beginning with the first seminar, which aims to explore the complexities of Palestinian citizenship, beyond the war in Gaza.

The first seminar: Palestinian Citizenship and Nationality

We will focus on **Palestinian citizenship**, exploring the differences, challenges, and advocacy efforts. Rather than solely focusing on the ongoing conflict in Gaza, our objective is to look at the historical background that has contributed to the oppression experienced by Palestinians across the region for decades.

The program:

- **Palestinians within Israel and Palestinian Territories:** situations of Palestinians residing within Israeli territory, the West Bank, East Jerusalem, and Gaza;
- **Palestinian Refugees in Lebanon**: the specific challenges faced by refugees in Lebanon, exploring their living conditions and implications for nationality and rights;
- **Palestinians in Jordan**: the refugee status and historical journey of Palestinians in Jordan, providing insights into their experiences and broader implications for the Palestinian narrative.

Objectives:

- 1. Deepen the comprehension and knowledge of the topic;
- 2. Inform participants about projects and internships in this field;
- 3. Facilitate connections with speakers for future research or advocacy initiatives.

The format: Presentations by our speakers followed by Q&A open discussion.
