## ARQUS II JOINT CALL FOR BIPs

### 1. Call objectives

Arqus BIP call for programmes aims to activate Blended Intensive Programmes (BIP) within the Alliance, ensuring Erasmus+ funds for the selected programmes.

Blended Intensive Programmes (BIP) are short, intensive programmes that use innovative ways of learning and teaching, including the use of online cooperation. These programmes for students and staff must comprise a short-term physical mobility abroad combined with a compulsory virtual component facilitating a collaborative online learning exchange and teamwork. The programmes have to be developed and implemented by at least 3 higher education institutions (HEIs) coming from at least 3 EU Member States and third countries associated to the programme and in this case at least 2 from the Arqus Alliance. BIP have been designed and are funded by the Erasmus+ programme.

### 2. Eligible activities

The Arqus European University Alliance brings together the universities of **Granada, Graz, Leipzig, Lyon 1, Maynooth, Minho, Padova, Vilnius and Wroclaw**. The Alliance's aim is to foster mobility even in its shorter versions .

According to Erasmus+ 21-27 programme, a BIP needs to involve at least 3 partners from Erasmus+ programme countries, and in this case at least 2 from the Arqus Alliance, to be considered eligible. Although learning activities involving extra partners outside Arqus in addition to the 2 minimum Arqus partners can participate, priority will be given to full Arqus BIPs.

One of the partners will cover the role of coordinator. The coordinator will host the in-presence activities for 5 (min) to 30 (max) days and provide at least 3 ECTS to all

participants<sup>1</sup>. The home institution of each participant will be responsible for the recognition of the credits in their career.

The virtual component is compulsory, but there are no constraints in timing or length.

The BIP should involve a minimum of mobile participants (10 to 20 depending on the hosting partners - details below) from Programme Country Universities. Participants can be either students (all cycles) or staff. Each partner is responsible for ensuring the minimum number of participants in each project in order to maintain the eligibility of the programme. In the application each programme will indicate the provisional division of spots.

Contents for both the physical and the virtual component should be co-designed by the partners and can be either interdisciplinary or very specific.

### **3. Financing**

This initiative is funded through Erasmus+ KA131 funds allocated by each university for Arqus BIPs.

The coordinator will receive an Organizational Support (OS) according to the number of mobile participants (400 EUR/participant) up to 8000 euros. The allocation of the OS might change according to national rules (e.g. In Italy programmes can only receive either 6000 or 8000 euros). Participants can receive more information by contacting the contact person at their institution (see chapter 9). The OS is a lump sum and can be spent for organizational costs and not to cover mobilities. Each university provides funds to approve a certain number of coordinating BIPs at their institution, according to the local budget.

For the second edition of this call, the following OS are available from 2024 Erasmus+ fundings for a total of 17 BIPs:

The selection committee may suggest a change of coordinator according to the availability of the budget.

Lecturers from partners with no budget available can anyway join projects hosted/coordinated by another Arqus university.

Arqus universities will also provide KA131 funds to cover the mobility of participants and co-organizing lecturers. The distribution of participants can be rearranged by the selection committee depending on the scholarships available at each institution.

Scholarships will be primarily granted to the participants selected through internal procedures. Unallocated scholarships of Arqus partners will in case be awarded through a dedicated joint call for participants. Arrangements with external partners should be handled by each project consortium instead.

All programmes can be implemented from December onwards and must be concluded by 31 July 2026.

Funds and scholarships management will depend on the internal regulations of each institution.

#### **4. Application deadlines and procedures**

Academics can apply for BIPs by submitting their applications via the [dedicated form](#)<sup>2</sup>.

- Deadline: 15 July 2025

The application form has to be filled in by one representative on behalf of all the institutions participating in the call. It will be possible to look for additional Arqus partners through the specific [padlet](#).

Through the application, applicants will be required to provide their contact details ( of all the responsible people at each partner institution) and information about their study field, as well as to present the overall project, its genesis, aims, learning outcome and impact, along with a provisional programme for the implementation.<sup>3</sup>

## 5. Selection criteria

The selection will be conducted taking into account the following criteria:

1. Learning outcomes (clearly explained and linked to the field of study of the students and/or the tasks carried on by the staff);
2. Implementation strategies;
3. Innovativeness of the contents and/or methods;
4. Sustainability of the action (follow-up and further development of the project);
5. Expected impact on the participants and the institution;
6. Applications related to the main Arqus II themes (**European Identity heritage, digital transformation and artificial intelligence; climate change and environmental sustainability**) are prioritized. Applications based on other topics will also be considered.

The selection committee will select projects taking into account both the quality of the proposals and the availability of funds. The selection committee may decide to prioritize proposals involving the highest number of Arqus partners.

An eligibility check of applications will be made by Arqus reference staff in each partner university prior to the selection.

A reserve list will be made out of the eligible applications not approved for funding. In case of cancellation of a programme the next programme in the ranking list from the same coordinating university will be awarded the funds or in the absence of it, funds

could be offered to a programme including the funding university as a partner, suggesting a change in the coordinator.

## **6. Selection committee**

The selection committee will be composed by Erasmus coordinators or academic experts in the Erasmus programme, in mobility or in the study fields relevant to the Arqus main themes.

Each university should nominate at least one member.

The Selection Committee will nominate one of its members as coordinator before starting the selection process.

The eligibility check will be run by the members of the Arqus working group 9 *Arqus on the Move*.

Grant notification will be provided to applicants by 30 July 2025 and duly launched on the Arqus website accordingly. Selected applicants will be required to inform the Selection Committee of the acceptance of the grant. The deadline for the acceptance will be specified in the grant notification.

## **7. Obligations of the selected applicants**

The coordinator institution will be required to release Attendance Certificates and Transcript of Records or equivalent documents for all the participants.

All selected programmes will be required to fill in a report at the end of the activities.

In case a BIP could not be realized within the time and rules provided, all parties have to be duly informed.

Any change to the organization of the BIP should be communicated to the Mobility Officers at each partner university and to the WG09 coordinators.

## **8. Implementation and added values**

The selected BIPs will be labeled as Arqus programmes.

At the end of the Programme, all participants (both mobile and local) will also receive an Arqus certificate of participation.

Mobility officers at each university will provide instructions on the overall implementation rules, financial management and mobility recognition once the programmes are selected and in accordance with the regulations at each institution.
